



## **How to incorporate a Translator button into your Browser (Internet Explorer 7 or FireFox)**

### **For FireFox**

Using FireFox go to [http://google.com/translate\\_buttons?hl=en](http://google.com/translate_buttons?hl=en)

Click on View in the menus at the top

then on the drop down Menu go to Toolbars

then click on Bookmarks – at which stage the Bookmark toolbar will appear

Look for the translation you want on the web page – click and drag it onto the new Bookmark toolbar.

Repeat the last stage for as many translations as you want.

### **For Internet Explorer7**

Using IE7 go to [http://google.com/translate\\_buttons?hl=en](http://google.com/translate_buttons?hl=en)

Look for the Links section, which is already in the toolbars section

Click and drag the divider next to the word Links down to make a new line, so that all the Links section is on it's own line.

Find the Translation you want, on the web page

Then right click on it and choose "Add to favourites"

Click Yes to "Do you want to continue?"

In the "Create In" box, click the down arrow , go to Links, and click on it.

Then click the "Add" button

Repeat the last stage for as many translations as you want.

### **Usage**

Now, whenever you want to translate a web page, just click the button you've added to the Links Toolbar.

Note :-

This is a machine translation (using the Google translator) – it's far from perfect, but useable

Only text in web pages is translated – some words are actually programmed into web pages as pictures, and these cannot be translated.
